They may be placed outside no earlier than 5 p.m. the night before your designated day. **Check the calendar for holiday changes.**



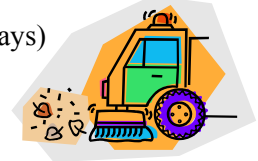
Christmas Tree Drop Off

Street Sweeper

The sweeper will operate (weather permitting and excluding City holidays) from April 5, 2010 through December 10, 2010.



Curbside Trash Collection Program

Each household is permitted a maximum of four bags or containers. Each bag or container must weigh less than 40 pounds. A permit can be obtained from City Hall for the collection and disposal of extra bags, furniture, and other items. Any questions may be directed to Public Works Director Paul Cronce at 397-2230 or City Hall at 397-0110. **Do not include concrete, grass, weeds, or branches with trash.** These may be taken to the Recycling Center (hours of operation are below).

LAMBERTVILLE CONTINUES SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING

In response to overwhelming requests from Lambertville’s residents, the city is implementing a “Single Stream” recycling program. Beginning immediately, residents are able to mix all their recyclables – **including plastics and cardboard** – into a single container. No more sorting! Just put them all together in one container. **Furthermore, the city will now be paid for every ton of recycling it delivers, instead of having to pay to have it hauled away.** The chart below lists the items you will now be able to recycle and how to prepare them. Also listed are items that are *not* recyclable which should be disposed of with your trash or through the County’s hazardous waste program.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS TO RECYCLE

Newspapers	Clean newsprint and the inserts that come with newspapers such as comics, glossy coupons, magazine sections and colored ads	Do not tie or place in plastic bags. Place loose in sealed collection container or bucket. Be sure to remove samples and plastics from junk mail	Plastic film weather bags (can be taken to the grocery store)
Other Papers & Junk Mail	Magazines, writing and school paper, envelopes with or without windows, copy paper, paperback books, hardcover books with covers removed, catalogs, phone books, store fliers, office papers, file folders, greeting cards, non-metallic gift wrapping paper and boxes		Tissue and toilet paper, photographs
Cardboard Paper & Chipboard	Corrugated cardboard, boxes and brown paper grocery bags, cereal and other non-wax coated food containers, tissue boxes, shoe boxes, clean corrugated pizza boxes and egg cartons	Flatten boxes, remove and discard Styrofoam and other packing materials	Waxed items and frozen food boxes, milk and juice containers, Styrofoam or plastic egg cartons
Glass (Containers Only)	Bottles and Jars of all colors with labels	Rinse clean; metal lids and tops acceptable	Plastic caps and tops, drinking glasses, All Pyrex
Plastics (Containers Only)	Bottles, jars and tubs with a #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7 in the recycling triangle such as beverage, milk, detergent, shampoo, margarine, and yogurt	Rinse clean; remove all caps, lids and tops. Dispose caps, lids and tops with regular trash	Any container without a recycling triangle #1 thru #7
Aluminum, Tin, Steel & Bimetal (Containers Only)	Soda, beverage and food containers, bimetal cans	Rinse clean; metal lids acceptable	Aerosol cans, items containing any substance residues, aluminum foil and pie plates, cooking pots and pans

- **RECYCLABLE METALS INCLUDING HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES, BIKES, CABINETS, ETC.** *Please note: No car parts, No Freon Products, refrigerators, freezers, or air conditioners. Propane gas tanks may be taken to Agway for a \$5 fee, or to the County Hazardous Waste Collection Day).*
- **BRANCHES, LEAVES, and GRASS CUTTINGS** go into the compost pile. Please do not leave plastic bags in compost pile.

 - × NO ELECTRONICS, STEREOS, TELEVISIONS, COMPUTERS OR COPIERS
 - × NO HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE
