ORDINANCE NUMBER 06-2021 An Ordinance to Amend the Lambertville City Code, 2014, Chapter 3, Section 17.4, Human Rights Council, Appointments, Compensation, Terms, Vacancies

\S 3-17.4 Council Established; Appointment; Compensation; Terms; Vacancies.

The City of Lambertville Human Rights Council (LHRC) will consist of a total of 11 members, from both the public and private sector, and is hereby established in the City of Lambertville. The members of the City of Lambertville Human Rights Council (LHRC) shall be appointed by the Mayor, with the advice and consent of the Lambertville City Council.

<u>a.</u>

Public Sector Members:

<u>1.</u>: The Mayor of the City of Lambertville, or his or her representative, to run concurrent with the Mayor's three-year term;

<u>2.</u>:The President of the Lambertville City Council, or his/her representative, for a one-year term;

3.:The Police Director or Officer-in-Charge of the City of Lambertville or his/her representative, for a one-year term;

<u>4.</u>: The Director of Public Assistance of the City of Lambertville, for a three-year term concurrent with the Mayor's three-year term;

5.:The President of Board of Education from the Lambertville-Stockton-West Amwell unified school district, or his/her representative, for three-year term concurrent with their term;

<u>6.</u>: The Chairperson of the Lambertville Free and Public Library, or his or her representative, for a one-vear term.

b. : Private Sector Members:

There shall be five members from the private sector appointed to serve on the Human Rights Council. They shall be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Governing Body and do not need to be residents of the municipality. One member may be a student of the South Hunterdon Regional School District.

All members of the LHRC shall serve without compensation.
