Minutes

- recap current status & actions taken thus far
 - new docket CP20-47, CAP informed and a few individuals intervened. The new application is split into 2 phases, with this docket for phase 1 of the route in PA.
 - City filed as intervenor: <u>https://elibrary.ferc.gov/idmws/file_list.asp?accession_num=20200304-5139</u>
 - $\circ~$ current comment period open until March 30 will circulate talking points with instructions how to comment
 - over 500 comments already on docket
 - city will file a comment, Kelly to circulate talking points
 - comments can mention that this should be a completely new application instead of an amendment
 - some challenges experienced by Judy & Kim, could be due to requirement to confirm FERC log on details. Were able to file comments but not file as intervenor
 - expect Environmental Assessment to be posted and then another comment period
 - will supreme court take case from 3rd circuit?
- PA side carbon county Request for Michael to connect with local CAP to see how we can support
- status update on resolution reaffirming City Council opposition to PennEast
 - look to be passed at upcoming council meeting, circulated with council members, need to update to reflect current status
- status update on area energy co-op
 - energy bills in April/May will have lower cost of energy and 28% renewables energy
 - o Another auction will take place in June with opportunity to increase renewables
 - 9 towns joined Hunterdon Area Co-op
 - Some press observed, more to come

- If in JCP&L then automatically move to new plan. If in third party plan, then need to opt in to plan.
- Next steps:
 - Continue to provide guidance to distribution list of CAP to comment on docket, post on facebook. Kim to draft communication to send out to distribution list.
 - Consider how to influence FERC
 - additional actions to take (schedule library hours to assist residents in commenting on docket, draft comment from City, etc)
 - plan spring city wide update tentatively scheduled evening of April 28 or May 4 at Justice Center – consider alternative given COVID-19 concerns.
 - Consider Facebook live event as alternative to face to face city wide update
 - o consider Swan Creek designation as C1 classification?
 - Townhall event with Tom Malinowski could be opportunity to raise topic
 - next meeting to focus on planning virtual townhall or consider smaller series of videos to keep top of mind
