OLD BUSINESS

- **LHRC 2020 Event Calendar**
 - Fri 4/24: South Hunterdon High School, Day of Silence
 - Sat 5/16: Pride Parade
 - Sun 6/7: Great Big Day/Together We Are Lambertville Picnic
- **Logo Sub-Committee – David Gardiner, Roni Todd-Marino, Bruce Harris**
 - Mission: To promote and protect human rights at the local level. Together, city representatives and resident members ensure that Lambertville remains a place of acceptance and love.
 - Tagline: Together We Are Lambertville ~ Juntos Somos Lambertville
 - 2020 Theme: Peace, Love & Lambertville
 - 2021 Theme: If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together
- **LGBTQ+ Focus**
 - South Hunterdon High School Gay Straight Alliance – requested our support on 2 events.

- Day of Silence – Fri 4/24. LHRC members/friends invited to join students at the end of day (2:30) for closing ceremony where silence is broken. Students to speak regarding who they are honoring. Come early (like 2:00) to sign in and get to the Library before school ends.
 - Pride Parade – Sat 5/16, help them with cost of registration (investigating \$\$) and cost of SHR GSA t-shirts (which will also be used on Day of Silence) so they can march – approx. \$500.
 - PRIDE PARADE – Sat 5/16. Register for parade (investigating \$\$). Banner needs to be ordered.
 - Marlene Pray – Doylestown – Rainbow Room is a resource for students
- **Student / Youth Community**
 - Suggestion: Safe/Fun Teen hangout space is needed in the city. Possible upstairs space avail at Lambertville Academy by Fisherman’s Mark. Filomena to check in with Marlene Pray to see if she’d be willing to help us set it up – then to check with Jennifer at Fisherman’s Mark to talk about space availability.
 - Filomena reported on SHRSD BOE initiative to improve educational equity, diversion & inclusion. New Superintendent recruitment has included a focus on these priorities.
 - Black History Month – Feb 2021 or event not confined to month of February– begin planning. Bruce Harris offered his speaking services. Filomena has worked with a local woman to create events in other school districts.
